

Discharge Instructions after Open Shoulder Repair

- A sling has been provided for you. Remain in your sling at all times. This includes sleeping in your sling.
- Use ice on the shoulder intermittently over the first 48 hours after surgery.
- Use the prescribed pain medicine liberally over the first 48 hours, and then you can begin to taper your use. <u>DO NOT TAKE MORE THAN THE PRESCIBED DOSE</u>. You may take Extra Strength Tylenol or Tylenol in place of the pain pills. <u>DO NOT</u> take ANY nonsteroidal antiinflammatory pain medications: Advil, Motrin, Ibuprofen, Aleve, Naproxen or Naprosyn.
- The clear dressing over the incision stays in place until the first follow up appointment.
- The clear dressing is waterproof, so you can shower when you get home. Just allow the water to run over the dressing. Make sure your axilla (armpit) is completely dry after showering.
- Take one 81mg aspirin, a day for 2 weeks after surgery, unless you have an aspirin sensitivity/ allergy or asthma.
- Pain medications CANNOT be refilled after hours or during the weekends and they CANNOT be called into a pharmacy. If you anticipate needing more, please plan accordingly.

For any urgent issues or problems including the following:

- Excessive redness around the incision
- Drainage for more than 4 days
- Fever of more than 101.5 F for more than a day
